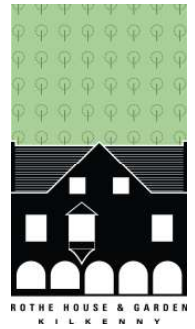

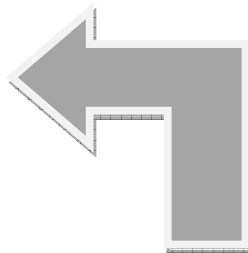

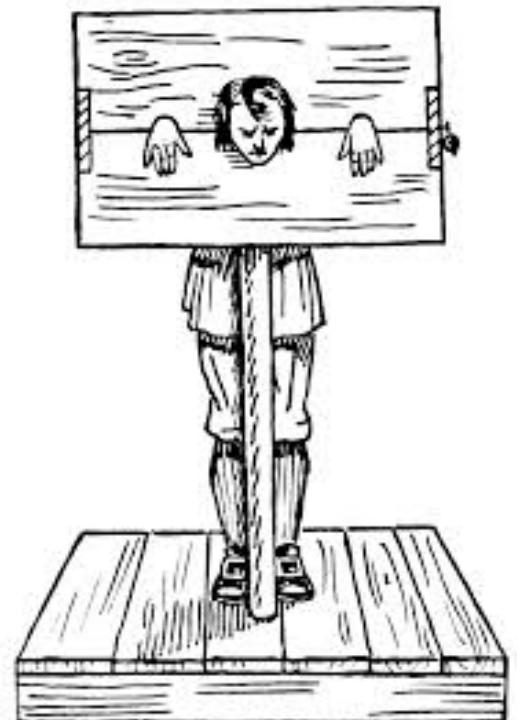
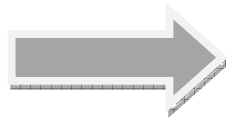
Second Courtyard

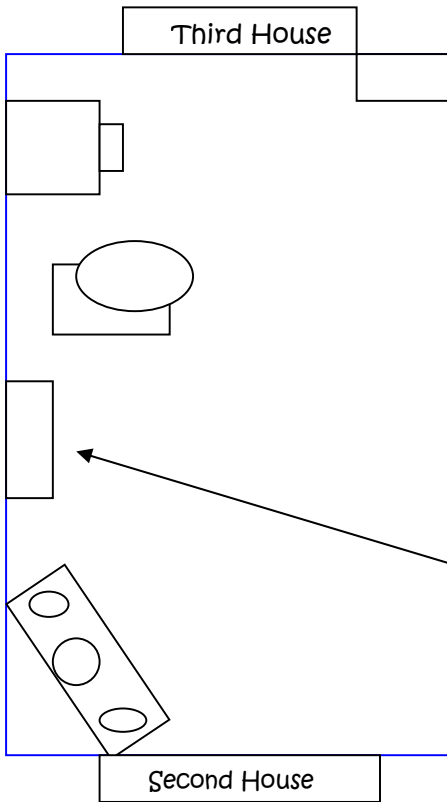
This is a **pillory** just like the one we have in our courtyard. Who would have been put into a pillory?
